Christmas Performances - As you will see from the Diary Dates, we have two Upper School Christmas performances taking place this year. This is so we can accommodate all our families who wish to attend.

Both performances are a 1.45 pm arrival for a 2 pm start. A letter will be coming out from the Teacher organising the performances this week, giving you the opportunity to reserve tickets for one of the dates (**max of 2 tickets per family**).





Access to YouTube - We've had a couple of queries within Annual Reviews, from families asking for support to help control the type of videos that can be seen on YouTube. Justin Sharp, our Federation ICT Manager, has produced the following:

Control the content that you see on YouTube:

It is possible to influence the content that appears on YouTube for you and/or your child or young person. As an application that isn't designed for under 13s, YouTube prides itself on a vast collection of algorithms that analyse your viewing habits and <u>attempts to recommend additional videos</u> along the same and similar topics. However these algorithms are not fool proof, and you can often find recommendations that don't align with your particular interests or beliefs popping up on your main page or automatically starting once a video you are watching has finished.

Here are several ways to try and control what those algorithms show you. None of them are an exact science and will not give you 100% coverage on avoiding unsuitable content, but they should give you a greater level of control over what you see.

DON'T share devices:

If all of your family accesses the same device for YouTube, and all do so using the same profile or login, the videos recommended to you will cover a wide variety of interests, maturity levels and suitability as everyone's viewing habits will be used to generate these recommendations.

It is recommended that adults do not share their personal device (i.e. tablet or mobile phone) with children in order to avoid this 'cross-contamination' of potentially mature content viewed by teenagers/adults and child-friendly content.

DO create user accounts for each person in your household:

On a <u>Windows</u> or <u>Apple</u> computer or laptop, each user in the home can have their own login for the device.

On certain Android tablets (i.e. <u>Kindle Fire</u>, <u>Samsung Galaxy Tab</u>) it is also possible to create separate user accounts. However, this is not possible on an iPad or iPhone.

This will keep the content being viewed by one user (i.e. a child) completely separate to that of another user, such as a teenager or adult, who uses a different account.

The recommendations should then only recommend suitable content appropriate to each user based on their viewing habits.

DO Influence the videos you're recommended via Dislike, Report and Not Interested options:

- Manage your recommendations and search results YouTube Help
- <u>Report inappropriate videos, channels and other content on YouTube -</u> <u>YouTube Help</u>

DO set up YouTube Restricted Mode:

Restricted Mode can increase the odds of screening out potentially mature content on YouTube.

This requires an adult with a Google Account to set up, which can then be managed on behalf of a child user.

Turn Restricted mode on or off on YouTube - YouTube Help

Wraparound Care - Last week, we sent out a <u>survey</u> asking for your interest if Bidwell Brook were able to apply for funding for a Breakfast Club. Only those families in Reception to Year 6 (class names with animals and colours) needed to respond to the survey, as Government funding is only available for our Primary pupils.
