**Bidwell Brook Proposal to Increase Pupil Numbers from September 2021** – Devon County Council continues its consultation to increase pupil numbers at Bidwell Brook. If you would like to make a comment, please do so via the email link within the “Full Proposal” document on the BB website.

**School Uniform** – Both Bidwell Brook and Ellen Tinkham have school uniform available for our pupils to wear. Although we appreciate some of our pupils find wearing a uniform difficult eg our sensory learners, we ask and encourage all remaining students to wear uniform from Reception right up to and including Year 11. The privilege of non-school uniform is only extended to our FE students. If you would like to find out about uniform available to purchase, please put a note in the Home School Diary and we will send information home. Thank you.

**English and Phonics Update** – In March 2020 (which seems SUCH a long time ago!), Ofsted Inspectors visited Ellen Tinkham to carry out a full two day inspection. Whilst the school remains “outstanding”, there were obviously areas which could be developed and one of these related to English and phonics.

Since March, the English Leads have reviewed our curriculum offer and put into place various initiatives to raise the profile of phonics in the classroom. Individual student 'reading bags' have been created which contain phonics assessments; resources such as sound cards, common exception word cards etc; an appropriate reading book (based on your child’s phonics assessment) and a reading record book to record daily reading sessions. These bags will be kept in class.

English (reading comprehension and writing) is being taught in classes at least four times a week and phonics will be taught daily to those students for whom it is appropriate.

We suggest all families might like to share a book or story with their child daily – even a couple of minutes would be great. Children gain so much from either looking or reading a book or magazine, or hearing you read. You could also try asking some questions whilst you share a book for example:

- How many “blue” things can you find on this page?
- Let’s look at the cover – what do you think might happen in this story?
- Which character did you like and why?
- *[Before turning a page]* What do you think is going to happen next?
- Can you make up a different ending to this story?

And don’t forget - picture books are just as valuable to share with your child as those with text.

The online home learning pages on our websites have lots of stories and features supporting English and phonics, so please dip into these resources every now and again.
