Dear Parents & Carers,

I hope you had a restful half term break, even if there was little opportunity to stay dry when outside!

Following the Government's announcement earlier this week, mainstream schools will be re-opening their doors to pupils from Monday 8th March. Our schools within the Learn to Live Federation have remained fully open throughout lockdown and we continue to welcome your child into school. Some children who are vulnerable and currently shielding, may still need to remain at home in line with medical advice you have been given. If you feel your child needs a phased return, please discuss this with your teacher as we wish to support you to get your child back into school.

Our staff continue to carry out lateral flow tests twice weekly. The Government has now advised Secondary age students will also be tested. We have no plans to test pupils in school as this would be intolerable for the vast majority. It is possible however that some older students may be able to tolerate lateral flow testing, but the decision for students (Secondary and FE only), to participate in lateral flow testing would be a decision for the family and young person and will not be imposed upon anyone. If you wish to consider access to tests for your young person, please discuss this with your teacher in the first instance.

Covid-19 Email Address – Thank you for continuing to inform us of any updates or results of Covid tests via the covid19@learntolivefederation.co.uk email address. This inbox continues to be closely monitored.

Survey – The <u>National Children's Bureau</u> (NCB) is running a national consultation to gain the voices and understand the experiences of children and young people with SEND during the Covid pandemic. There is an online survey, with 8 questions, that can be completed by parents, and children and young people. The link to the survey is here: <u>CYP/Parents survey</u>

If you could complete the questions with your child AND as a family, this would be great - every single survey counts and your responses are anonymous. The deadline to complete the survey is Monday 8th March, so you have just over a week to complete it. This is a really worthwhile and valuable consultation as it will inform DfE responses for recovery and it is vital that our children and young people are heard loud and clear! Thank you very much.



SPACE* Tech Loans for Young People - Space* are currently offering tech loans for young people. You can apply for a chromebook or other tech including a mouse or headphones for a current device, or phone handsets (not SIM cards). The items supplied are to enable greater social connectivity, the ability to join online youth or support groups and for school work.
