PUSHED FOR TIME? QUICK SUMMARY:

- Rise in Devon's Covid-19 Cases You will know from local TV and radio updates that Covid-19 case numbers have risen across the region. At school, we are still keeping our pupils within their "bubbles" and making sure our staff continue to work in a safe manner (twice weekly lateral flow testing, wearing masks in the corridors, washing hands, using hand sanitiser). It is likely we will keep pupils in "bubbles" until the end of the Summer term.
- **BB Rural Skills Update** There's lots happening in our Rural Skills Dept! Selected Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5 students are working towards their Level 1 BTEC in Land Based Studies and also Construction. We have new staff who are working on the allotment. We've received some money to purchase a poly-tunnel, a new fruit cage, new gardening tools and plants. The staff are also working on the Sensory Trail but this is taking a bit of time.

Dear Parents & Carers,

Rise in Devon's Covid-19 Cases – Having attended a number of County Council meetings over the last few days, Devon is currently experiencing an exponential rise in the number of Covid-19 cases. Health Professionals attending these meetings have confirmed the Delta variant of Covid-19 has not yet fully impacted across the region but there is an increased number of positive cases being reported, particularly in Devon's secondary schools.

This is likely due to secondary-aged students regularly taking lateral flow tests which identify and confirm positive cases, whereas primary pupils and special needs pupils do not need to take a test.

As Senior Leaders, we review our Risk Assessments and Safer Working Practice and constantly monitor to check our schools are as safe as possible within the current Government guidelines. Our pupils are still keeping within their "bubbles" and there is no intention at present to deviate away from our "bubble" working before the end of this term. This will help keep our pupils and staff as safe as possible until we break for the summer holiday. Staff continue to take and register their lateral flow tests twice weekly, wash hands regularly, use hand sanitiser and wear face masks when in corridors and communal areas.

Rural Skills Update from Tom Bates, Rural Skills Lead - The Rural Skills site at Bidwell Brook School has been operational for a little over 5 years and in April, we had two new members of staff join the team. Alex Hannis, the original team member, will be making a sideways move and working across both Bidwell Brook and Ellen Tinkham soon, delivering and assessing Level 1 BTEC's in Land Based Studies and also in Construction to some of our Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5 students. At Bidwell Brook, the two new members of staff will be delivering our Rural Skills programme and making further improvements and developments to the site.

At Bidwell Brook, we have also been successful in obtaining significant grant funding for the redevelopment of the school allotment which now forms part of the Rural Skills site. This is hugely exciting as it has allowed us to invest in much needed resources for the horticultural elements of the programme, including a new poly-tunnel, fruit cage, bespoke composting system, raised beds, and stock fencing, as well as make repairs to the existing shed. We have also begun clearing low-value woodland under-storey to make space for an orchard.


Once completed, these works will not only facilitate the Land Based Studies BTEC but, given the knowledge and skills of members within the team, provide the foundation for a highly productive and accessible garden.

Works are also continuing (albeit more slowly), on the Sensory Play Trail, which will be sited near the outdoor classroom in the original Rural Skills area and provide a natural and physical way for students to explore, exercise and self-regulate.


